We have often boasted that EEE still has the same dues and visitors' fees that we had when we first began in 1990. It has been our policy to keep our fees as low as possible and to regularly subsidize events such as trips and luncheons. Unfortunately reality is beginning to undermine our ways of operating. When you consider that our present \$40 semester dues gives someone the option of attending 25 lectures, that EEE's operating cost per lecture is \$370, and that we have additional expenses as well, our dilemma becomes quite clear.

We all know that the cost of everything has gone up substantially in 22 years. Sadly, our expenses now threaten to exceed our income.

The Board is currently busy searching for solutions. As a Board we are just regular EEE attendees, like you. The Board, along with many committee members, is a hardworking group which is deeply committed to our mission of providing stimulating and informational lectures as well as nurturing community among us. At present, the Board is considering the possibility of seeking grants to support our efforts. We also are attempting to enhance our publicity in order to reach more people.

Please remember, though, that EEE belongs to all of us.

We welcome and value your ideas and suggestions. Here are our thoughts so far--several ways that people might help:

- **Become a Member** - When you join as a member, you support EEE and give us a more solid base of income.
